Observe and explore positive guidance techniques and activities for preschoolers to support interactions with children. Create and design play experiences for children that promote development. Design and develop plans and ideas for the new infant/toddler/and preschool center. Meeting and learning from parents and teachers of young children in order to understanding the needs of a child. And to create and put on large events for communities that support families with young children.

**\*\*\*\*\*Community Media: (3 Credits per semester)** Let's look at our community & world with an artistic eye. Together we will build the skills needed to promote and visualize our lives. Through the use of visual mediums such as photography, cinematography and various art styles we will capture what makes our lives interesting and unique.

**Sports Development: (5 Credits per semester)** It's Game Time! The Sports Development class will introduce team and individual sports units (soccer, volleyball, basketball, track and field and much more) to further develop skills, hand eye coordination, understanding of the rules of a given game or sport and cooperative activities that build community.

**Mentoring: (5 Credits per semester and is a prerequisite for Education Career Pathway)** The mentoring program is an opportunity to make an impact through bonding with elementary school aged youth. High school students will connect with elementary students to be positive role models that care about their future. Students will become Big Brothers or Big Sisters and through that role they will develop a deeper sense of their role and responsibility in their community.

**Self-Expression: (5 Credits per semester)** Self-Expression Project Group will dive into creative ways of self-expression through various medians such as knitting, poems, art, plays, wood working, short stories and much more. The class will utilize creative projects to cast light on social justice in our world and bring further understanding to issues that are important to our youth.

**SCIENCE BY EBAYS: (5 Credits per semester)** The East Bay Academy for Young Scientists after school program is designed to help students increase their problem solving abilities and understanding of important science concepts that together will help them achieve greater success in the future. The program will include the following components: 1) Hands-on learning activities related to the concept of energy; 2) Air and water quality research projects within East Oakland communities; 3) Field trips; and 4) Guest speaker presentations.

\*\*\*\*\***Facilitation 101:** (3 credits per semester) Mentoring Tool Kit is a facilitation developmental class. Students will gain valuable skills utilizing classroom management tools to better perform as a facilitator. This is a hands-on experiential course but doesn't require a student to be a part of the Mentoring (Monday/Wednesday) Class.
